

Camporee Finale

Materials

Units must provide the following:

Each Troop provides a Properly Uniformed Senior Patrol Leader wearing Class A (neckerchief optional.) with a backpack containing a ground cloth, sleeping bag, personal hygiene items with TP, eating utensils, water bottle, flashlight, and a book of matches

Each Patrol will need:

- Six 5' staves
- One large ground cloth or tarp
- Eight boy scouts
- One patrol flag, banner, or rag.
- Three tent stakes
- One device for setting tent stakes
- One sharp pocket knife

Directions


1. At the North end of the site, the Senior Patrol Leader displays the required items on ground-cloth, undresses, and gets into sleeping bag.
2. At the south end of the site, each patrol assembles opposite their SPL with their required materials and a supply of binders twine.
3. Patrol sends 3 Patrol members to North end, 5 remain at South end.
4. On signal to start:
 - A. Senior Patrol Leader:
 - a) Exits sleeping bag.
 - b) Puts on Uniform
 - c) Packs backpack and sleeping bag.
 - d) Runs to South end of the site (contest area).
5. When the SPL reaches the patrol, the patrol builds a "Roman Chariot" using the required items.
6. Using the chariot four (4) patrol members transport the fifth to the North end of the site.
7. When the Chariot arrives at the North end, the patrol builds a letter and transports one (1) member to the south end while others disassemble the chariot.

8. When the litter bearers and patient reach the South end , all patrol members gather in the center of the site and:

- A. Using the staves and lashings, construct a long patrol flagpole.
- B. Raise and guy the long (tall) flagpole.

9. The first patrol to raise its flagpole wins. The Flag pole must be freestanding; no one may hold it up when guyed.

Lashings	Patrol Teams	Informal
ROMAN CHARIOT RACE		
Equipment: For each patrol six Scout staves, nine pieces of sash cord for lashings.		
Action: Equipment is placed in piles opposite patrols. On signal, patrols run and lash "chariot." This done by making a trestle frame, as in building a bridge. Four staves form a square; the fifth and sixth staves are lashed diagonally to opposite two sides. When frame is finished, two Scouts pull "chariot" and rider down the field around a marker and back to finish line.		
Scoring: First patrol at finish with "chariot" intact wins.
